Please make reference to the self-evaluation, relevant school data, the progress against School Strategic Plan (SSP) goals, targets, and the diagnosis of issues requiring particular attention.	<p>After conducted a review of the school's 2019 NAPLAN results and Semester 1 2019 Teacher Judgements we decided that 'Reading' was the area of the school we needed to focus on for 2020. We achieved our goal of being above similar schools in the top 2 bands of Yr 3 NAPLAN but were 10% below similar schools in Yr 5. Our Relative Growth data from Yr 3 2017 to Yr 5 2019 was 9%, which is very low, this has been a consistent trend for the past 4 years. Our average for the past 3 years is 13%. Our teacher judgements are inconsistent with our results from NAPLAN and from our PAT comprehension scores.</p> <p>We have shown an improvement in some areas of our SSP goals but not in others. We have set goals for 2020 so we can work towards these.</p> <p>Developing consistent practice around 'Reading' is an area requiring particular attention for our school, developing an instructional model, especially for Reading, will be a major focus for 2020.</p>

Goal setting, sense of confidence and student resilience have all decreased from 2018. In 2019 we had 'The Resilience Project' conduct sessions with staff, parents and students so this initiative will continue in 2020. We have worked with Learning Labs, and funding will continue in 2020 which will help to support our goal of developing student voice and agency.</p>
